WHAT IS A QUESTION ?



Questions are sentences expressed in such a way as to gather information, which require an answer.



'Why' is trying to get the reason for his friend's shouting.



'Where' is trying to get the answer regarding the place of his lost wallet.



Whose dress is this ?



How many students were present in the class yesterday ?



Is your friend coming today ?

In the above sentences, **'How many'**, **'Whose'** and **'Is'** are used to frame the questions.

Words that come in the beginning of the sentences and make the sentence a question are called **Question words**.

Eg.: What, Why, When, Where, Whose, Whom, How much, How many etc.

HOW TO MAKE QUESTION TAGS ?

To convert a positive sentence to negative, add **NOT**.

- +

They practice yoga.

→

They don't practice yoga.
- +

Did they watch T. V last night ?

→

Didn't they watch T. V last night ?

QUESTION TAGS

A Question tag is a small question at the end of a statement.

She reads novels, doesn't she ?

Question tags are used when asking for an agreement or a confirmation.

Boys love football, don't they ?
