
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### **ACTIVE & PASSIVE VOICE**

### **ACTIVE & PASSIVE VOICE**



The function of 'voice' in grammar is to tell whether the subject does an action or an action is done to the subject.




#### **ACTIVE VOICE**

In Active Voice, the subject is active as the subject performs the action shown by the verb. The subject is always written before the verb because it is the main doer of the action. The object becomes the receiver of the action.




### **PASSIVE VOICE**

In Passive Voice, the object is active as the object performs the action shown by the verb. The object is always written before the verb because it is the main doer of the action. The subject becomes only the receiver of the action.
